I attach a scan of a cover which may answer Mr. David Whiteley's query about the postal rate applied on the first flight from Karachi to Australia in 1931. The stamps affixed are of 12as., 4as., and 2as., total value = 1Re. 2as. Picture below right.

The first amount shows the airmail surcharge, the amount in brackets shows the total postage including 2as letter postage.

The postage shown by the questioner as well as the postage shown by Zahid Islam are valid. It must be checked whether the items are sent by airmail or surface route within Australia.



Answer by Joachim Wrede (FGI), 29. September 2012

I detected the following literature dealing more or less the question. The number 1 of the list shows – including sources – the facts which Chr. Sperber has compiled (see left). The number 2 describes the source mentioned by Chr. Sperber. The numbers 3 – 6 deal with the subject 'early airmail'; I do not know whether and how detailed the actual question is answered.
